

USINA CORURIPE

Usina Coruripe was founded in the early twentieth century, on February 12th, 1925, from the union of several mills, which already expressed at that time the potential of sugarcane in the municipality of Coruripe, 120 kilometres from Maceió, Alagoas. In January 1941, the entrepreneur Tércio Wanderley acquired shareholding control of the company. Years of hard work and dedication transformed the small plant into one of the largest sugar, alcohol and energy producing groups in Brazil.

Nowadays the Group has 05 industrial units and 01 railway terminal and is present in the states of São Paulo, Minas Gerais, Alagoas e Mato Grosso do Sul.

PRESERVED BIODIVERSITY IN USINA'S CORURIPE FOREST RESERVES



Preservation of over 25.000 hectares of native forests in the Cerrado and Mata Atlântica biomes.



Implementation of 5 Private Natural Heritage Reserves (RPPN – Portuguese acronym) with investments around R\$ 2 million per year to fauna and flora preservation, research and environmental education.



Ongoing production of up to 80.000 seedlings from Mata Atlântica for use in reforestation of ecological corridors, springs and river and stream banks.



It has a partnership with the State Forest Institute (Instituto Estadual de Florestas - IEF) to release wild animals captured in captivity and reintroduce and monitor endangered fauna.
